

Eating out in New York...why do we do it? Because our kitchens are small, we're too busy, and hey, cooking is probably only 15% cheaper. Or at least that's what we tell ourselves when we're spending \$81 on a hamburger (**Old Homestead Steakhouse** (Map 5)). But even those of us who have to cook can't resist the allure of some of the best and most varied cuisine in the world. For New Yorkers, eating out is simultaneously a science and an art form. Since we have so many options, we don't seem to be able to waste any meal on a haphazard choice of venue. Selecting exactly the right restaurant for an occasion is not just a matter of taste, particularly when you're preparing to splurge; it requires knowledge, logic, strategy, and even risk assessment (is it beginning to sound like a competitive sport?). We may want a certain type of cuisine, near a subway line convenient for all parties involved, with atmosphere but not romantic, in a specific price range. And with over 25,000 options, we can always find the perfect place. Whether we're looking for a restaurant with a rare 28 from Zagat's (the culinary Bible for many New Yorkers), or we want to roll the dice with an undiscovered hole in the wall where even the Board of Health fears to tread, we will never have to settle. There is, of course, a huge drawback: we are downright spoiled. But I guess we'll just have to live with that.

Eating Old

Since New York City is a culinary hotspot with lots of big names (and wannabe big names) at work in the kitchens, it's easy to get swept up in food trends that often involve dishes that look more like art projects than meals. Many of the more experimental restaurants do merit attention, but when you're not in the mood for Parmesan cheese ice cream with pesto foam in a braised kale emulsion, you can avail yourselves of the Big Apple's time-honored stalwarts. Rub elbows with the who's who at the posh 21 **Club** (Map 12) (circa 1929); dine on New American cuisine at the ancient, 213-year-old **Bridge Café** (Map 3); slurp fresh-shucked oysters under the vaulted, tiled ceiling at Grand Central Station's **Oyster Bar** (Map 13) (circa 1913), and do not miss their desserts; sample more oysters and one of the best burgers in existence at the venerable Midtown watering hole **P.J. Clarke's** (Map 13) (since 1884); or expand your culinary horizons with calf's spleen and cheese on a roll at **Ferdinando's Focacceria** (Map 32) (circa 1904).

Eating Cheap

Eating cheap has become more stylish thanks to the recent trend of highbrow chefs and restaurateurs going lowbrow. At Danny Meyer's **Shake Shack** (Map 9), you can grab a cheeseburger for \$4 or one of their legendary Chicago Dogs (a brick-in-itself) for only \$3.25. In addition to its (meat-and-

mortar location, **Daisy May's BBQ USA** (Map 11), co-owned by Adam Perry Lang (Le Cirque, Daniel, Chanterelle), has multiple stretch carts throughout the city where you can fetch a hearty bowl of award-winning "Bowl'O Red" Texas-style chili for \$7 and some serious cue. Ethnic food has always been a great friend to eaters on a budget. Vietnamese: **Cong Ly** (Map 3). Chinese: **New Green Bo** (Map 3). Wo **Ho** (Map 3). Joe's Shanghai (Map 3, 12). **Food Shing** (Map 3). Middle Eastern (**Hummus Place** (Map 6), **Gazala Place** (Map 11)), and Mexican joints (the taqueria at The Corner a.k.a. **La Esquina** (Map 6)) deserve repeat visits even if you're not trying to be frugal. And now, thanks to a new influx of hip hot dog joints, you can branch out from **Katz's Delicatessen** (Map 7). **Papaya King** (Map 17) has kept hot dog lovers grinning since 1932. And many of us can't survive a day without at least one of the staples of NYC Jewish eats—bagels and knishes. For bagels, go with perennial winners **Ess-a-Bagel** (Map 10, 13) and **H&H Bagels** (Map 11, 14), or try our favorites: **David's Bagels** (Map 7, 10), **Kossar's Bialys** (Map 4), **Absolute Bagels** (Map 16), or the original **Tal Bagels** (Map 13). For knishes, nothing beats the **Yonah Schimmel Knish Bakery** (Map 7).

Eating Hip

Eating hip usually involves the food of the moment (tacos, lobster rolls, Asian street food), beautiful people (those who often look like they never eat), and some kind of exclusivity (ridiculously long waits, unpublished phone numbers, impossible-to-come-by reservations, or no reservations at all). Food snobs may warn you that the appetite that's satisfied is the craving to see and be seen, rather than the desire for the city's best culinary experience. That being said, the ultimate in cool dining is, of course, **Rao's** (Map 20)—or so we hear. But unless you're the Mayor, the Governor, or Woody Allen, you probably won't be getting a reservation anytime soon, so don't hold your breath. It's a similar story at the newly renovated Graydon Carter-owned, restaurant-cum-speakeasy, **The Waverly Inn** (Map 5), where it is rumored that only A-listers have access to the secret phone number and the walk-in waits for a table can be epic (if not eternal). In the realm of destinations accessible to mere mortals with the patience of a saint, the perpetually packed gastro pub **Spotted Pig** (Map 5) tops the list; getting elbowed in the jaw every time you're about to take a bite might ruin your meal, so aim for off-hours (and expect to wait anyway). Be sure to try the equally crowded, no-reservations eatery **Freemans** (Map 6), which hides itself at the end of an alleyway; do not miss the pork chops. Take an i.v. drip to sustain you while you wait for lobster rolls at **Pearl Oyster Bar** (Map 5) and **Mary's Fish Camp** (Map 5) (where Amy Sedaris used to wait tables just for fun). **Employees Only** (Map 5) draws trendsters who'll find drinking and dining to the tunes of the Clash and Lou Reed

(while garter-clad waitresses wearing vintage headwear sexily saunter around), and not caring at all what the food tastes like. **Momofuku Noodle Bar** (Map 7) and its new offshoot **Momofuku Ssam Bar** (Map 6) lure in lovers of noodles and all things porky, but of course don't go to either if you're in any kind of a rush. And for those of you who have a penchant for restaurants with celebrity chefs (with celebrity tempers), and get a thrill from sitting at one of the most exclusive tables in town, pull whatever strings you've got for an evening of hip indulgence at the chef's table in the kitchen of **Gordon Ramsay at the London** (Map 12).

Eating Late

Kang Suh's (Map 9) Korean barbecue runs all night, as well as **Bereket** (Map 7), **Odessa** (Map 7), **7A** (Map 7), **Yaffa Café** (Map 7), and a host of generic diners. **Employees Only** (Map 5) serves a special "\$11 Staff Meal" available between midnight and 4 a.m. And, of course, **Blue Ribbon** (Map 6) is still one of the best places to eat after midnight.

Eating Pizza

Pizza constitutes a food group unto itself for New Yorkers. The coal oven spots top most lists: **Grimaldi's** (Map 30), **Lombardi's** (Map 6), **Luzzo's** (Map 7), and the original **Patsy's** (Map 20) in East Harlem. The coal oven enjoys extra cachet by virtue of being illegal now, except in the aforementioned eateries where they were already in operation when legislation was passed prohibiting them. The brick oven joints, such as **John's Pizzeria** (Map 5), **Nick's** (Map 17), **Franney's** (Map 33), **Slice of Harlem** (Map 19), and **Totonno's Pizzeria Napolitano** (Map 10) never seem to slow down either. A Brooklyn favorite, the cozy, family-run **Amorina** (Map 33), has the added benefit of spectacle—you literally watch your pizza get made a few feet away from your table. For a classic Village scene complete with live jazz, check out **Arturo's** (Map 6) on Houston Street. Pizza by the slice practically deserves its own category, but the highlights include **Patsy's** (Map 20) and **Joe's** (Map 5).

Eating Ethnic

Spin a globe, stick your finger onto a spot blindly, and chances are you can find cuisine from that country on offer in New York. And an outstanding offering will be to wit: **Sammy's Roumanian** (Map 6), **Katz's Delicatessen** (Map 7), and **Carnegie Deli** (Map 12) (Jewish); **Shun Lee** (Map 13), **Grand Sichuan International** (Map 8, 11), and **Chef Ho's Peking Duck Grill** (Map 17) (Chinese); **Dawat** (Map 13), **Tabla** (Map 9), and **Indian Tandour Oven** (Map 15) (Indian); **Alma** (Map 32), **El Paso** (Map 17, 20) and **Rosita Mexicana** (Map 9, 13, 14) (Mexican); **Kang Suh** (Map 9) and **Dok Suni's** (Map

7) (Korean); **Nobu** (Map 2) and about 40 others (Japanese); **Babbo** (Map 6), **Felidia** (Map 13), **Il Mulino** (Map 6), **Sfoglia** (Map 17), **I Trulli** (Map 10), and countless others (Italian); **Ghenet** (Map 6) and **Zoma** (Map 19) (Ethiopian); **Eight Mile Creek** (Map 6) (Australian); **Balthazar** (Map 6), **Chantrelle** (Map 2), **Café D'Alsace** (Map 17), **La Lune-choerette** (Map 8), **Jules** (Map 4), and so many more (French); **Good World** (Map 6) and **Aquavit** (Map 12) (Scandinavian); **Heidelberg** (Map 15), **Zum Schneider** (Map 7), and **Hallo Berlin** (Map 11) (German); **Charles' Southern Style** (Map 22), **Sylvia's** (Map 19), and **Old Devil Moon** (Map 7) (Southern); **Kefi** (Map 14) and **Elias Corner** (Map 26) (Greek); **Sigiri** (Map 7) (Sri Lankan) etc. etc. etc.

Eating Meat

New York is home to arguably the world's best steakhouse, **Peter Luger's** (Map 29). But it's competitive at the top, and clawing at Luger's heels are the newish **Mark Joseph Steakhouse** (Map 3), and classics like **Sparks** (Map 13), **Palm** (Map 13), **Smith & Wollensky** (Map 13), **Angelo & Maxie's** (Map 10), and the **Strip House** (Map 6). For the Brazilian-style "all you can eat meat fest," **Churrascaria Plataforma** (Map 11) does the trick. As for hamburgers, the rankings provide material for eternal debate. Many of the favorites find their way to the top of some list or another: **P.J. Clarke** (Map 13), **Corner Bistro** (Map 5), **Burger Joint at Le Parker Meridien** (Map 12), **J.G. Melon** (Map 15), **Big Nick's** (Map 14), and **Pastis**, to name a few. New on the scene is **Royale** (Map 7), where they compliment the perfect patty with stellar fixins', for a song. For a change of pace from your burger tour, look for evidence that we Yankees can indeed produce some damn good BBQ: **Blue Smoke** (Map 10), **Dinosaur Bar-B-Que** (Map 18), and **RUB BBQ** (Map 9) in Manhattan, and **Smoke Joint** (Map 31) and **Fette Sau** (Map 29) in Brooklyn (arrive early at the latter, they run out of the most popular items quickly). And wherever you go, be prepared to wash down your 'cue with some serious bourbon.

Eating Meatless

We're advanced enough here that most restaurants (except perhaps those mentioned directly above) offer at least a few items palatable to vegetarians. But don't worry, every kind of appetite gets special attention here, including non-meat-eaters. Try a whole range of vegan/macrobiotic at **Angelica Kitchen** (Map 6), the quality Indian fare at **Pongal** (Map 10), and, for high-end eats, **Candle 79** (Map 15) and the vegan **Hangawi** (Map 9) (even your carnivorous friends will love it). Vegetarians have even found some of their favorite dishes in less likely places, including the stuffed peppers at the otherwise carnivorous **Rosa Mexicana** (Map 9, 13, 14).

Eating Your Wallet

You don't have to live in this city long before realizing that while we technically use the same currency as the rest of the country, it's actually worth about half as much here as elsewhere. Even the most frugal among us have found ourselves spending 100 New York dollars on a night out and thinking we got off easy. But remember that when it comes to dining out, there is no cap. You can easily spend over \$150 (per person) at any number of highly regarded restaurants around town, even if you're feeling abstemious. Never mind the likes of Masa, which has a \$400 prix fixe. No doubt you've been just dying to try Batali's this, and Morimoto's that. But handle the decision to dine at the top culinary echelon as you would (or should) handle the prospect of an open bar at your holiday office party: Know your limit (financially, emotionally, morally), and try not to do anything you'll regret in the morning. If you can keep your food down after witnessing triple digits on your share of the tab, start on the slippery slope to gastronomically induced bankruptcy at the following restaurants, which rarely disappoint: **Babbo (Map 6)**, **Per Se (Map 12)**, **Gramercy Tavern (Map 9)**, **Chatterelle (Map 2)**, **Le Bernardin (Map 12)**, **Tru (Map 2)**, **Oceana (Map 13)**, **Union Square Cafe (Map 9)**, and **Daniel (Map 15)**. And remember to manage

your expectations: Unless you fall in love with your waiter or waitress, the experience will not change your life. Although Per Se comes pretty damn close.

Our Favorite Restaurants

Consensus on such a crucial and personal matter is always elusive, but with a group of New Yorkers opinionated enough to produce the NYT, all we can say is, "Fuhgeddaboutit." We've historically granted the accolade to **Blue Ribbon (Map 6)**—it's open 'til 4 a.m., it's where the chefs of other restaurants go, it's got fondue, it's got beef marrow, it's got fried chicken, it's got a great vibe, great liquor, and great service. And it will always have that special place in our hearts and stomachs, but this year we're also giving a nod to a few other spots: **Sigiri (Map 7)**, a spicy Sri Lankan gem that is BYOB to boot, **Babbo (Map 6)**, well, because it's Babbo, **Fuleen Seafood (Map 3)**, the number one reason to eat lunch in Chinatown, and **Eisenberg's Sandwich Shop (Map 9)**, a classic, old-school diner counter that's still serving up egg creams and BLTs to the locals.

Overview

If you ever get bored in New York City, you have only yourself to blame. When it comes to nightlife in particular, the only difficulty you'll have is in choosing amongst the seemingly infinite options for entertainment. New York's top weeklies—*The Village Voice* and *Time Out New York*—offer their round-ups of goings on about town, as do the e-mail newsletters such as *Flavorpill* (www.flavorpill.net), *My Open Bar* (www.myopenbar.com), *Daily Candy* (www.dailycandy.com), and *Nonsense NYC* (www.nonsenseinc.com) who each week direct you towards various concerts, multimedia events, and new bars. Over time you'll figure out which sources you trust and which venues you favor, and the explorer in you will thrive on checking out the new watering holes that seem to be sprouting like weeds downtown and in Brooklyn. For those of you who require more than a perfect drink in the ideal setting: LVHRD hosts monthly themed parties at secret locations (www.lvhrd.com). Below you'll find a few choice destinations for the key genres in evening diversion—dive bars, dance spots, music venues and much more. A word of caution: don't forget to pace yourselves.

Dive Bars

There is no shortage of dumps in this city, so we've done our best to single out the darkest and the dirtiest. A popular choice among our staff is the oh-so derelict **Mars Bar (Map 6)**—clean freaks should use the bathroom wherever they are before they get here. Other downtown favorites include **Bleed & Gold (Map 6)**, **Grassroots Tavern (Map 6)**, and **Holiday Lounge (Map 6)**. On the other side of the East River, check out the **Turkey's Nest (Map 29)** in Williamsburg. And yes, there are even dives uptown. Try **Jimmy's Corner (Map 12)**, **P&G (Map 14)**, **The Subway Inn (Map 15)**, **Reif's Tavern (Map 17)**, or **1020 Bar (Map 18)**.

Best Beer Selection

When it comes to sheer beer selection, there are a number of worthy contenders. The heavily trodden **Peculier Pub (Map 6)** offers an extensive, though expensive, beer list. Visit this one on a weekday if you want to take advantage of some one-on-one time with the bartender. The **Ginger Man (Map 9)** in lower Midtown stocks over 100 kinds of bottled brew, and has over 60 options on tap. **Vol de Nuit (Map 5)** has a large number of Belgian beers and a warm but reclusive atmosphere. **Flatiron's Silver Swan (Map 9)** offers a slew of beer choices to wash down its German fare. Ditto for **Zum Schneider (Map 7)**. Hipster-fave **Otherroom (Map 5)** has a solid selection, too (and it's either beer or wine there, so don't take friends who can't live without the hard stuff). Other places to try: **Blind Tiger Ale House (Map 5)** and **The Waterfront Ale House (Map 10)**. **Heartland Brewery (Map 1, 12)** brews its own in multiple Midtown locations, but expect more of a touristy scene. **Spuytten Duyvil (Map 29)** in Williamsburg offers many rare finds among its 100-plus beers, and a great atmosphere to boot.

Outdoor Spaces

Outdoor space is a precious commodity here, so combine it with cocktails and you've got the perfect destination for city dwellers who just don't want to be cooped up on those all-too-rare temperate evenings. Truth be told, though, you'll find New Yorkers stubbornly holding court at outdoor venues in pretty much any weather short of electrical storms and sub-freezing temperatures, and they'll only retreat in those conditions when chased indoors by the staff. Take note that bars with outdoor patios have circumvented the no-smoking legislation—either a perk or a put-off, depending on your inclination. We love the aptly named **Gowanus Yacht Club (Map 32)** in Carroll Gardens. This intimate beer garden serves up cold ones with dogs and burgers in a cocktail setting. Other patios to check out include **Sweet & Vicious (Map 6)**, **The Park (Map 8)**, and the **Heights Bar & Grill (Map 18)**. Other Brooklyn highlights include **The Gate (Map 33)** in Park Slope, and Williamsburg's **Pete's Candy Store (Map 29)**, **Union Pool (Map 29)**, and **Huckleberry (Map 29)**.

Best Jukebox

Personal taste factors heavily in this category of course, but here is a condensed list of NFT picks. For Manhattan: **Ace Bar (Map 7)** (indie rock/punk), **Hi-Fi (Map 7)** (a huge and diverse selection), **Lakeside Lounge (Map 7)** (a little something for everybody), **7B (Map 7)** (rock all the way), **Rudy's Bar & Grill (Map 11)** (blues), **Welcome to the Johnsons (Map 7)** (indie rock/punk). For Brooklyn: **The Charleston (Map 29)** (Williamsburg—old school), **Great Lakes (Map 33)** (Park Slope—indie rock), **The Boat (Map 32)** (Carroll Gardens—indie rock), **The Levee (Map 29)** (Williamsburg—good all around), and the **Brooklyn Social Club (Map 32)** (Carroll Gardens—country/soul goodness).

Smoker-Friendly

Despite Bloomberg's efforts to create a smoke-free New York, there are a few loopholes in the current legislation. You can still light up in cigar bars and hookah bars, bars with outdoor spaces, and privately owned establishments. Despite its total lack of ventilation, **Hudson Bar & Books (Map 5)** is a favorite destination for smokers. Smoking is also permitted at its sister uptown location, **Lexington Bar & Books (Map 15)** (jacket required). On the Upper East Side, **Club Macanudo (Map 15)** goes for a country club atmosphere. Also try **Circa Tabac (Map 2)** (cigar bar). A good number of the city's non-smoking bars will permit the act late at night, but that's entirely up to the establishment. Some have developed clever solutions: in Brooklyn at **Larry Lawrence (Map 29)**, a lofted patio allows smokers to keep an eye on the action in the bar below.

Dance Clubs

New York's old cabaret laws make it tough to find free dance spots, but they do exist (albeit often with the velvet rope scenario that may deter the impatient). We like **Lit (Map 6)**, **Good World (Map 4)**, and **Riffi (Map 6)**. If you don't mind shelling out the dough, definitely try **Capitale (Map 3)** (located in the old Bowery Savings Bank). On the weekends, entry into the swankier clubs doesn't come without paying your dues in long lines and pricey cover charges, but many of them have reduced rates on weeknights. For a less glossy crowd in and around Williamsburg, we suggest checking out the lively dance scenes at **Bembe (Map 29)**, **Black Betty (Map 29)**, and **Royal Oak (Map 29)**.

Costly Cocktails

If you don't mind spending a few extra bucks on your drinking habit, there is no shortage of options. **Bar Venice (Map 6)**, **Inoteca (Map 7)**, and the enoteca at **Trulli (Map 10)** are heaven for conophiles, with the added perk of flights on offer at the latter. The bar at the **Peninsula Hotel (Map 12)** boasts views nearly as staggering as its prices. Other noteworthy settings include **The Campbell Apartment (Map 13)** in Grand Central Station, and the hard-to-access **Angel's Share (Map 6)**, which also provides an unusual view from its cozy divans.

Music - Overview

New York caters to a wide array of tastes in everything, and music is no exception. From the indie rock clubs of the Lower East Side to the history-steeped jazz clubs in the Village to amateur night at the Apollo, your musical thirst can seemingly be quenched in every possible way.

Jazz, Blues, Folk and Country

There are plenty of places to see jazz in the city, starting off with classic joints like the **Village Vanguard (Map 5)**, **Birdland (Map 11)**, the **Blue Note (Map 6)**, and the **Iridium (Map 12)**, which all draw top notch talent. For a smaller (and cheaper) jazz experience, try the **Lenox Lounge (Map 19)** and **St. Nick's Pub (Map 21)** in Harlem, or the **Arthur's Tavern (Map 5)** in the Village. The **Nuyorican Poets Café (Map 7)** has frequent jazz performances. In Brooklyn, your best bet is the **BAM Café (Map 31)**. (Sadly we've lost Tonix, which hosted a great range of jazz and world music from established and undiscovered artists.)

The big change for jazz in NYC has been the new Jazz at Lincoln Center complex in the Time Warner Center on Columbus Circle. It has three rooms: the 1,000+ seat, designed-for-jazz Rose Theater, the Allen Room, an amphitheater with a great view of the park, and the nightclub-esque Dizzy's Club Coca Cola.

The blues can make an appearance in all sorts of clubs, but **Terra Blues (Map 6)** focuses on the art form and features reliably top-notch music on an otherwise tired Bleeker

Street scene. You can even find a taste of the south in our part. For country, try **Rodeo Bar (Map 10)**, **Hank's Saloon (Map 33)**, or **Parkside Lounge (Map 7)** on Mondays. **BrooklynCountryMusic.com** keeps track of who's fiddlin' in Brooklyn.

Rock and Pop

It's been a tough couple of years for Manhattan rock clubs. LES favorite Luna Lounge got priced out of the scene it helped to create and moved to Brooklyn. CBGB's closed, and bizarrely moved to Las Vegas. The Continental took the Brownie's approach and stopped featuring live music. Oh, and Sin- and Rothko's closed as well, if anyone cares. But don't despair, all is not lost. Bowery Presents, the people behind two of the best clubs in the city—**Mercury Lounge (Map 7)** and **Bowery Ballroom (Map 6)**—have added **Music Hall of Williamsburg (Map 29)** to their mini-empire. At the same time, Clear Channel—spawned Live Nation has set up a competing chain of venues, including **Rebel (Map 9)** (formerly Downtime). Whether a system of two big venue powers and a bunch of little guys develops, and whether this will benefit artists and audiences, remains to be seen. **Bowery Ballroom (Map 6)** remains the top live venue, featuring big acts but with excellent sound and a good layout. **Irving Plaza (Map 10)** is a good place to see a show as well. The **Beacon Theater (Map 14)** tends to land the biggest names, if not the newest. **Roseland (Map 12)** is billed as an intimate venue for high-profile acts, but good luck getting tickets for the Stones or anyone else of that ilk.

The best small club is **Mercury Lounge (Map 7)**, which gets great bands right before they're ready to move up to Bowery, and features a big stage and audience area (though the bar can be really cramped). As far as the rest of the Lower East Side/East Village area goes, it helps if you like your clubs to be (faux) punky basements. Try **Lit (Map 6)** or **Cake Shop (Map 7)**. In Brooklyn, try **Music Hall of Williamsburg (Map 29)**, **Union Hall (Map 33)**, **Magnetic Field (Map 32)**, **Southpaw (Map 33)**, or **Trash (Map 29)**. And **Maxwell's (Map 34)** is still your best bet in Hoboken.

Finally, a couple of great websites to check out to keep up on who's in town: **OhMyRockness.com** and **BrooklynVegan.com**.

Experimental

A number of venues in New York provide a place for experimental music to get exposure. **Experimental Intermedia (Map 3)** and **Roulette (Map 2)** are fully dedicated to showcasing the avant-garde. Jon Zorn's place, **The Stone (Map 7)**, takes an experimental approach towards the performance space as well as the music, with a different artist acting as curator for an entire month, no drinks or food, and the artists taking in 100% of door proceeds. **The Kitchen (Map 8)** features experimental music in addition to film, dance, and other art forms.

Everything Else

A few places run the gamut of musical genres. **The Knitting Factory (Map 3)** can have everything from jazz to metal (and three stages to boot). **Town Hall (Map 12)** gets folksy artists one night, hot Latin toward the next, and a slew of comedy, spoken word, and other acts. **Joe's Pub (Map 6)** presents an excellent variety of popular styles and often hosts celebrated international musicians. **The Cutting Rooms (Map 9)** offerings include jazz, soul, rock, vocal, and more. Keep an eye on **BAMcafé (Map 31)** for a variety of great performers.

For a cabaret or piano bar, try **Don't Tell Mama (Map 11)** or **The Duplex (Map 5)**. For a more plush experience, try the **Café Carlyle (Map 15)** or **Oak Room (Map 12)** at the Algonquin Hotel. But for top cabaret talent at affordable prices, go directly to **The Metropolitan Room (Map 9)**.

If you're seeking some R&B or soul, check out the **Apollo Theater (Map 19)**, though they mostly get "oldies" acts. The Apollo's Amateur Night on Wednesday is your chance to see some up-and-comers. Both the **Bowery Poetry**

Club (Map 6) and **The Pyramid Club (Map 7)** have open mic MC'ing nights. Many dance clubs feature Hip-hop DJs.

Barbes (Map 33) in Park Slope hosts a wide palette of "world music" (for lack of a better term), including Latin American, European, and traditional US styles, plus more experimental fare. For more sounds of the south, **SOB's (Map 5)** has live South American music and dancing and **Remy Lounge (Map 1)** has DJs spinning Latin pop, house, salsa, merengue, and more. **Nublu (Map 7)** is always reliable for a fun and sweaty night, especially on Wednesdays when they feature Brazilian bands and DJs.

We don't need to hear Liza Minelli or Frank Sinatra sing it to remember the famous line about New York City: "If I can make it here, I'll make it anywhere." A corollary of sorts might be, "If they'll make it anywhere, I can buy it there." From tasteful to tacky, classic to classless, delicious to dangerous, we've got it all: life-size stuffed animals, Ming vases, toys for, shall we say, adventurous adults, live eels, exotic spices, and even illegal fruits (but you didn't hear it here). It requires enormous self-restraint to take a walk, even just to the subway, and not buy something. And while we natives and traditionalists do occasionally lament the "mallification" of our fair city, we'll challenge anyone to find another place that combines convenience and quirkiness as well as this town does. You want Prada knock-offs? Chinatown. You want the real thing? Just walk north a few blocks. A real human skeleton? Cross the street. Homemade ricotta? It's practically next door. You can hunt for bargains or blow a year's salary in the blink of an eye. And even if you decide to leave your wallet at home in the interests of self-preservation, you can find endless entertainment in walking the streets and practicing the storied art of window-shopping.

Clothing and Accessories

Shopping for haute couture is no longer strictly an uptown affair, with a few high-end shops appearing in SoHo and the Meatpacking District, but the Upper East Side is still the ultimate destination for designer labels. Madison Avenue is the main artery, in the 50s, 60s, and 70s, rounded out by Fifth Avenue in the 50s and a few blocks east along 57th St. There you will find **Chanel (Map 12)**, **Burberry (Map 12)**, and all other names of that ilk. Take note, these stores still observe the age-old tradition, abandoned in most neighborhoods, of closing on Sundays. For department store shopping, try **Bloomingdale's (Map 3, 15)** for the widest range of selection, **Macy's (Map 9)** for value, and **Lord & Taylor (Map 9)** and **Saks Fifth Avenue (Map 12)** for the classics, **Henri Bendel (Map 12)** and **Barneys (Map 15)** for trendier lines, and **Bergdorf Goodman (Map 12)** if money is no object. If you have the patience to deal with the crowds and sift through the merchandise to find bargains, **Century 21 (Map 1)** can yield great rewards of name brand clothing, shoes, make-up, accessories, and home wares at significantly discounted prices. For cheap and trendy, **H&M (Map 13, 19)** can't be beat. It's disposable clothing for the fashionistas, but be prepared to change in the aisles on crowded shopping days.

SoHo is one of the neighborhoods that's taken on features of an outdoor mall in recent years, with big chain stores taking the place of the smaller boutiques (and the few art galleries that survived the arrival of said boutiques). That said, if you can handle floods of tourists, it's still a great place to shop because of the wide range of stores in a concentrated area (and plenty of cafés when you need to refuel). You'll find big names like **Prada (Map 6)**, whose Renzo Piano design draws as many visitors as Miuccia's clothes do. There's even the downtown branch of **Bloomingdale's (Map 3)**, a slightly hipper version of its Upper East Side big brother. In addition to the standards, you'll find many street vendors selling everything from handmade jewelry to floppy-eared children's hats. Some

of the quieter streets like Thompson, Sullivan, and Wooster appeal to the shopper who aims to avoid the chain stores. Take advantage of the fact that SoHo is densely packed and great for walking; just cruise the streets to discover hidden gems like **MOBS! (Map 6)**, where you'll find a riotous outdoor wear and bags designed by a Canadian architect.

The West Village has its own enclave of hip clothing stores like **Stella McCartney (Map 5)**. Head northwest to the Meatpacking District and you can see the results of an impressive urban magic trick that transformed racks of hanging beef into racks of hanging jeans that cost \$800. Check out the punk rock-inspired styles of **Alexander McQueen (Map 5)**, as well as the envelope-pushing and wallet-emptying department store **Jeffrey (Map 5)**, the subject of a reoccurring Saturday Night Live skit that's a send-up of the clerks' reputed snobbery. The other destinations for fashions from up-and-coming designers and great independent boutiques are NoHo (the area north of Houston and east of Broadway), NoLita (north of Little Italy), and the East Village.

The Upper East Side (particularly along Madison Avenue in the East 80s) has a notable amount of designer consignment stores. **Bis Designer Resale (Map 15)** and others like it sell gently worn items from top tier designers like Chanel and Armani at a fraction of their original cost. You can also meander along "Thrift Row," a string of Upper East Side thrift shops and near Third Avenue in the East 70s and 80s. Many of these shops, such as the **Spence-Chapin Thrift Shop (Map 17)**, carry a nice selection of designer clothing—*not* to mention the added bonus that the proceeds from your purchases go toward a good cause, like AIDS-related charities, cancer research, and adoption programs.

Vintage Shopping

The abundance of vintage shops—over 60 at last count—will impress any shopper, whether you're someone who's just looking for a unique piece for a special occasion or a professional stylist purchasing wardrobe for a period film. Though many vintage shops downtown have closed over the years due to astronomical rents, some holdouts deserve attention: **Fabulous Fanny's (Map 6)** in the East Village, **Frock (Map 7)** and **Edith Machinist (Map 7)** on the Lower East Side, **Screaming Mimi's (Map 6)** in NoHo, **What Comes Around Goes Around (Map 2)** in SoHo, **Family Jewels (Map 9)** and **Fisch for the Hip (Map 9)** in Chelsea. In Brooklyn, check out **Williamsburg's Beacon's Closet (Map 29)** and **Amarcord Vintage Fashion (Map 7, 29)**, and **Park Slope's Beacon's Closet (Map 33)**. You'll even find some relatively undiscovered options uptown. On the Upper East Side, check out **New York Vintage Club (Map 13)** and **Vintage Collections (Map 15)**. And don't forget the twice-yearly vintage couture and textiles auction at **Doyle New York (Map 17)**. On the Upper West Side, longtime vintage purveyor **Allan & Suzi (Map 14)** still holds court at the corner of Amsterdam and 80th Street. For you die-hards, be sure to attend the thrice-yearly Manhattan Vintage Clothing Show at the Metropolitan Pavilion, where over 75 dealers sell their vintage finery during two-day stints. And finally, there's always the Triple Pier Antiques

Show on the far West Side of Manhattan. It should go without saying that at all of the above-mentioned shops and venues, you must be prepared to pay the usual New York City premium.

Flea Markets, Street Vendors, Street Fairs & Bazaars

New Yorkers who once spent weekends perusing the eclectic finds in the asphalt lot at 26th Street and Sixth Avenue are still mourning the loss of the internationally known Annex Antiques Fair & Flea Market. The good news is that many of the same vendors from Annex sell their wares at the **Annex/Hell's Kitchen Flea Market (Map 11)** on 39th Street between Ninth and Tenth Avenues. There are, of course, many other (albeit smaller) flea markets throughout the city, as well as numerous street fairs in various neighborhoods during warmer months. The best way to find them tends to be to accidentally stumble upon them on an exploratory walk around town. A fantastic indoor flea market to add to your must-see list is **The Market NYC (Map 6)**, a refreshingly offbeat collection from young, local designers who aren't afraid to be truly creative. These places provide a cure for chain shopping boredom and the inevitable annoyance at seeing every third person wearing the same H&M shirt as you. Another fun option (particularly during the warmer months) is shopping street side from designers who sell their one-of-a-kind designs al fresco. You can't always identify them by name, but you can't miss their stands along Prince and Spring Streets in SoHo. Look for made-while-you-wait purses and belts, the scrap metal jewelry pieces, handmade leather-bound journals, and other singular and quirky items.

Sports

Paragon Sporting Goods (Map 9) in Union Square is hard to beat as a one-stop shop for all sports gear and accessories. They also take care of your recreational needs, with services like all-inclusive ski packages for Hunter Mountain and permitting for the NYC Parks Department tennis courts. **Sports Authority (Map 9, 13)**, **Foot Locker (Map 21, 23, 25)**, and **Modell's (Map 23)** provide a broad range of affordable sports clothing, shoes, and athletic equipment. **Blades Board & Skate (Map 14)** features groovy gear for boarding (both the wheeled and snow varieties) as well as a good selection of the latest equipment. **Everything Must Go (Map 20)**, a recently opened El Barrio skate store, carries skateboards and clothing—and has amassed a loyal neighborhood following. For the best cold weather and mountain gear, head to **Tents & Trails (Map 3)** or **Patagonia (Map 14)** (you can expect competitive prices at the former, but definitely not at the latter).

Housewares and Home Design

You can lose hours in **ABC Carpet & Home (Map 9)** just off of Union Square. Design fanatics can appreciate their ex-

otic array of furnishings (much of it antique and imported from Asia and Europe) even if they can't afford the steep prices. **Fish's Eddy (Map 9)**, **Pottery Barn (Map 13)**, and **Bed Bath & Beyond (Map 9)** offer the basics with a wide selection of styles and prices. For professional-grade kitchen supplies at the best prices around, explore the restaurant suppliers on Bowery. **Bridge Kitchenware (Map 13)** is another favorite among the city's cooks, as is the oft-ignored second floor at **Zabar's (Map 14)**. For paint, window dressings, and other home decorating supplies, try **Janovic (Map 2, 5, 9, 11, 16)**. Prepare for sensory overload if you take on the over 200,000 square feet of commercial and residential furnishings at the **A&D Building (Map 13)**. Showrooms are open to the public, unlike at some of the smaller design shops nearby, which require business cards upon entry. Don't miss the **Conran Store (Map 13)** a few blocks away, in its quirky freestanding location under the Queensboro Bridge. And even if you can't afford the cutting edge design items, the friendly staff lets you enjoy a free game (or two) of foosball on the floor model.

Electronics

J&R (Map 3) provides most things electronic, including computers and accessories, iPods, games, cameras, music equipment, CDs, DVDs, and household appliances. **B&H (Map 8)** is the top destination for professionals and amateurs when it comes to photographic, audio, and video equipment. It's worth a visit just to witness the pure spectacle of this well-coordinated operation, as well as the outstanding selection of gear. Note that the megastore is run by Orthodox Jews who strictly observe the Sabbath and holidays, and thus you should always check the hours and days of operation posted on their website before heading over. Audiophiles are wonderfully served by **Stereo Exchange (Map 6)** and the jaw-dropping, price-busting **Sound by Singer (Map 9)**. Other places to shop for electronics include the **Apple Store (Map 6, 12)** and **Tekserve (Map 9)**, the (other) Apple specialists.

Food

With residents from every corner of the globe who collectively speak over 170 languages, New York couldn't help but be an exciting destination for food shopping. The offerings are as diverse as the population, whether you're looking for the best of the basics or exotic spices and other imported specialties. Two revered empires make the Upper West Side a culinary destination—**Fairway (Maps 14, 18)** and **Zabar's (Map 14)**—and the Zabar's offshoot, **Vinegar Factory (Map 17)**, graces the Upper East. The national chain **Whole Foods (Maps 6, 9, and 14)** is multiplying, and now there's even a **Trader Joe's (Map 6)**, though only devotees can brave the crowds there. But the city's real gems come in the form of the increasing number of **Greenmarkets** (the largest is in Union Square **Map 9** four days a week), and the ethnic food purveyors stocked with imported goods from around the world. When it comes to Italian, Arthur Ave in the Bronx is famed for its bakeries, butcher shops, grocers, and sundry shops. The more centrally located **DiPalo Dairy (Map 3)** offers some of the

best imported delicacies as well as their own celebrated fresh ricotta. For Middle Eastern specialties, **Sahadi's (Map 32)** provides the most impressive range of top quality products at prices that cannot be beat and many of its neighbors on Atlantic Ave. deserve a visit while you're in the area. Chinatown's options will overwhelm and exhaust you before they disappoint even the pickiest of shoppers, and there's even a destination for people in the market for British treats, **Myers of Keswick (Map 5)** in the West Village. We could go on and on, but we'll let you get out there to start eating and exploring your way through the city's culinary delights.

Art Supplies

Running low on Cadmium Red? Use your last stick of charcoal drawing a nude? The best art stores in NYC are scattered loosely around the SoHo area, with **Pearl Paint (Map 3)** being the most well known. Located at the corner of Mercer and Canal Streets, the store occupies a full six-story building with every type of art supply you can imagine, including a great separate frame shop out back on Lispenard. Closer to NYU and Cooper Union, you can find the best selection of paper at **New York Central Art Supply (Map 6)** on Third Avenue. **SoHo Art Materials (Map 3)** on Grand Street is a small, traditional shop that sells super premium paints and brushes for fine artists. Don't forget to check out both **Sam Fajl (Map 9, 13)** and **A.J. Friedman (Map 9)** in the Flatiron area for graphic design supplies, portfolios, and gifts. Should you find yourself on the Upper East Side needing art supplies in a pinch, the fairly decent selection at **Blacker & Kooby (Map 17)** will do just fine.

As the art scene has made its way to Williamsburg, having a supply store close by is as important as a good supermarket (something folks in the 'burg are still waiting for). **Artist & Craftsman (Map 29)** on North 8th is a good bet for supplies.

*Remember to flash that student ID card if you've got it, as most art stores offer a decent discount...

Music Equipment & Instruments

New York's large and vibrant music scene supports a thriving instrument trade. To buy a new tuba or get that banjo tuned, head over to 48th Street. You'll find the largest, most well known stores, from generalist shops such as **Manny's (Map 12)** and **Sam Ash (Map 12)**, to more specialized shops like **Roberts's Woodwind Repair (Map 12)**. Just two blocks away, on 46th, drummers can make themselves at home in a store dedicated solely to their craft—**Drummer's World (Map 12)**.

If you can't take the bustle of the Times Square area and are looking for used, vintage, or just plain cool, then you'll want to shop elsewhere. Some of our favorites include: **East Village Music (Map 6)**, **First Flight (Map 7)**, **30th Street Guitars (Map 9)**, **Rogue Music (Map 9)**, and **Ludlow Guitars (Map 7)**.

For an exquisite purchase where money is no object, find the perfect grand piano at **Klavierhaus (Map 12)**

or **Steinway Pianos (Map 12)**, where the salespeople pride themselves on matching even beginners with the perfect instrument for their skills and character. Also keep an eye (and an ear) out for special musical evenings at the former, and spontaneous performances at the latter.

The best remaining destination for sheet music is still the **Joseph Patelson Music House (Map 12)**.

Music for Listening

New Yorkers are still lamenting the 2006 demise of Tower Records, but fortunately there remain myriad options for music lovers who aren't satisfied with trawling the iTunes store for their fixes. Whether you just want that Top Ten hit or you are hunting for a rare LP, you have a range of destinations from which to choose. For those who like to dig, there's **Kim's Mediapolis (Map 18)**, where you're sure to find something for your record collection. For a more conventional experience, head to **J&R Music World (Map 3)** or the **Virgin Megastore (Map 6, 12)**.

The smaller stores offer more eclectic selections and usually boast a knowledgeable staff as well. Try **Other Music (Map 6)** and **Earwax (Map 29)** in Brooklyn—two stores with unique vibes. If you're still hungry for more, head to **Bleeker Street** to check out **Rebel (Map 5)** and **Bleeker Street Records (Map 5)**.

Shopping "Districts"

If you're fixated on a specific item, like a sausage maker or a few yards of leopard print fabric, you can shop in specialty districts around Manhattan. Brave the overwhelming selection throughout the Garment District (25th to 40th Sts, Fifth to Ninth Aves) for fabrics, buttons, zippers, ribbons, and anything else you'd need to design your own clothes. Men looking for the perfect romantic gift might want to check out the Diamond and Jewelry District (W 47th between Fifth and Sixth Aves), the world's largest market for diamonds, the Flower District (26th to 29th Sts, along and off Sixth Ave), and the Perfume District (along and off Broadway in the West 20s and 30s). Music Row (48th St between Sixth & Seventh Aves) leaves you with no excuses if you've been meaning to learn to play an instrument. The Bowery around Houston is another well-known strip where you'll find the Kitchenware District for all your culinary endeavors, the Lighting District (past Delancey St) for all your illuminating needs, and the Downtown Jewelry District (turn the corner of Bowery to Canal St) for the more unusual baubles you can't get uptown. High-end home design stores are concentrated on and around Designers Way and Decorators Way (58th and 59th Sts between Second and Third Aves). The Flatiron District (W 14th to 34th Sts, between Sixth & Park Aves) is another home furnishing mecca. You can also take care of your photography needs where the pros do, with the city's highest concentration of stores and labs (between 5th and 6th Aves, from 18th to 22nd Sts). Sadly, Book Row (between 9th and 14th Sts) is no more. What was once an assemblage of over 25 bookstores now houses only the famous Strand Bookstore and Alabaster Bookshop, but avid readers could happily spend days browsing and purchasing in either one of them...

Overview

If you want to see cutting-edge art, go to New York City's galleries. There are more than 500 galleries in the city, with artwork created in every conceivable medium (and of varying quality) on display. SoHo, Chelsea, DUMBO, and Williamsburg are the hot spots for gallery goers, but there are also many famous (and often more traditional) galleries and auction houses uptown, including **Christie's (Map 12)** and **Sotheby's (Map 15)**. With so much to choose from, there's almost always something that's at least *provocative*, if not actually *good*.

The scene at the upscale galleries is sometimes intimidating, especially if you look like you are on a budget. If you aren't interested in buying, they aren't interested in you being there. Some bigger galleries require appointments. Cut your teeth at smaller galleries; they aren't as scary. Also, put your name on the mailing lists. You'll get invites to openings so crowded that no one will try to pressure you into buying (and there's free wine). The Armory Show, an annual show of new art, is also a great way to see what the galleries have to offer without intimidation.

SoHo Area

Five years ago, there were still hundreds of art galleries in SoHo. Now it has practically become an outdoor mall. However, there are still some permanent artworks in gallery spaces, such as Walter De Maria's excellent *The Broken Kilometer* (Map 6) (a Dia-sponsored space at 393 West Broadway), and his sublime *New York Earth Room* (Map 6). A short jaunt down to TriBeCa will land you in LaMonte Young's awesome aural experience *Dream House* at the **MELA Foundation (Map 2)**. **Artists Space (Map 2)**, one of

the first alternative art galleries in New York, is also in TriBeCa. The **HERE Arts Center (Map 5)** showcases a wide range of work and usually offers an exhibit or performance that warrants a visit

Chelsea

The commercialization of SoHo has helped make Chelsea the center of the city's gallery scene. Our recommendation is to hit at least two streets—W 24th Street between Tenth and Eleventh avenues, and W 22nd Street between Tenth and Eleventh avenues. W 24th Street is anchored by the almost-always-brilliant **Gagosian Gallery (Map 8)** and also includes the **Luhning Augustine (Map 8)**, **Charles Cowles (Map 8)**, **Mary Boone (Map 8)**, **Barbara Gladstone (Map 8)**, and **Matthew Marks (Map 8)** galleries. W 22nd has the architecture-friendly **Max Protech (Map 8)** gallery and the **Julie Saul (Map 8)**, **Leslie Tonkonow (Map 8)**, **Marianne Boesky (Map 8)**, **Pace Wildenstein (Map 8)**, and **Yancey Richardson (Map 8)** galleries. Also, check out the famous "artists'" bookstore **Printed Matter (Map 8)**.

Perhaps the final nail in the coffin of SoHo's art scene was **Exit Art's (Map 8)** move to 475 Tenth Avenue a couple years back. This gallery is well-known for brilliant group shows, exhibiting everything from album covers to multimedia installations, and killer openings. It's highly recommended.

Other recommendations are the Starrett-Lehigh Building (Map 8, 601 W 26th St), not only for the art but also for the great pillars, windows, and converted freight elevators, **Esso (Map 8)** for Pop Art, the **Daniel Reich Gallery (Map 8)**, and the **Jonathan LeVine Gallery (Map 8)**, which consistently features exciting artists.

The New York City book scene has taken a sharp decline in terms of diversity in recent years, with many excellent bookshops—including Coliseum Books, A Different Light, Academy, A Photographer's Place, Rizzoli SoHo, Tower Books, Brentano's, Spring Street Books, and Shortwave—all going the way of the dodo. The remaining independent stores are now the last outposts before everything interesting or alternative disappears altogether. And some of NYC's richest cultural neighborhoods—such as the East Village and the Lower East Side—don't have enough bookstores to even come close to properly serving their populations of literate hipsters. So we thought we'd take this opportunity to list some of our favorite remaining shops...

General New/Used

The Strand (Map 6) on Broadway, the largest and arguably most popular independent bookstore in town, boasts staggering range and depth in its offerings (and often the best prices around to boot). Whether you're interested in art tomes, rare first editions, foreign language texts, nonfiction works, or the latest bestseller, it's impossible to be disappointed. **Gotham Book Mart (Map 12)** remains Midtown's major literary watering hole, and **St. Mark's Bookshop (Map 6)** anchors the border between the NYU crowd and the East Village hipster contingent. Both Gotham and St. Mark's have excellent literary journal selections. **Argosy Book Store (Map 13)** on 59th Street is still a top destination for antiquarian books. Uptown, **Morningside Bookshop (Map 18)** and **Labyrinth (Map 18)** serve the Columbia area well. With four locations around the city, the punchy **Shakespeare & Company (Maps 1, 6, 10, and 15)** is a local chain that somehow manages to maintain an aura of independence. In the West Village, **Three Lives and Co. (Map 5)** should be your destination. **The Barnes & Noble (Map 9)** in Union Square is their signature store and has a great feel. The **Housing Works Used Book Café (Map 6)** has a vintage coffeehouse feel and is one of our favorite bookstores—all of the profits go to help homeless New Yorkers living with HIV/AIDS.

Small/Used

Fortunately there are still a lot of used bookstores tucked away all over the city. **Mercer Street Books (Map 6)** serves NYU. **East Village Books (Map 7)** takes care of hipster heaven, and **Skyline (Map 9)** remains a good Chelsea destination. In Brooklyn, **Park Slope Books (Map 33)**, a.k.a. 7th Avenue Books, is a fun browse.

Travel

The city's travel book selection is possibly its greatest strength—from the **Hagstrom Map & Travel (Map 12)** near Bryant Park to several independents, such as the elegant **Complete Traveller Bookstore (Map 9)** and SoHo's **Traveler's Choice Bookstore (Map 2)**.

Art

Printed Matter (Map 8) houses one of the best collections of artists' books in the world and is highly recommended. **The New Museum of Contemporary Art Bookstore (Map 6)** also offers a brilliant selection of both artists' and art books. If you aren't on a budget and have a new coffee table to fill, try **Ursus (Map 15)** in Chelsea.

NYC/Government

The City Store (Map 3) in the Municipal Building is small but carries a solid selection (and is still the only store we've seen that sells old taxicab medallions). **The Civil Service Bookstore (Map 3)** has all the study guides you'll need when you want to change careers and start driving a bus. **The United Nations Bookshop (Map 13)** has a great range of international and governmental titles. **The New York Transit Museum (Map 12)** shop at Grand Central also has an excellent range of books on NYC.

Specialty

Books of Wonder (Map 9) in Chelsea has long been a downtown haven for children's books, and kids love that it adjoins a cupcake bakery. Two mystery shops, **They Mysterious Book Shop (Map 2)** and **Partners & Crime (Map 5)**, slake the need for whodunits. **The Drama Book Shop (Map 12)** is a great source for books on acting and the theater. **Biography Book Shop (Map 5)** speaks for itself. **Urban Center Books (Map 12)** is well known for its architecture collection. **Librairie de France (Map 12)**, located in Rockefeller Center, sells books written exclusively in (you guessed it) French. **Bluestockings (Map 7)** is an epicenter for radical and feminist literature. **Oscar Wilde Books (Map 5)** in the West Village is one of the world's largest gay and lesbian bookstores.

Readings

Anyone can read great authors, but lucky for New Yorkers, we have beaucoup chances to meet the literati, too. The four-story **Barnes & Noble (Map 9)** in Union Square regularly hosts major writers (Tom Wolfe, Nick Hornby, and former President Bill Clinton are a few of the recent guests). **Housing Works Used Book Café (Map 6)** draws some big names; Philip Gourevitch and Jonathan Lethem have discussed their tomes there in the last few years. And **McNally Robinson (Map 6)** in Nolita is another spot known for hosting great author events. Nearly all bookstores present readings, even if irregularly. Check a store's Web page for listings. Literary blogs like www.maudnewton.com list weekly events for bookworms. Even bars have taken a literary turn for the better: KGB Bar features fiction, poetry, and nonfiction readings each week (www.kgbbar.com) and *One Story* magazine hosts an excellent monthly reading series at Pianos (www.one-story.com). In Brooklyn, Pete's Candy Store and its weekly reading series are a good bet for your weekly dose of literature (www.petscandystore.com).

Multiplexes abound in NYC, though of course you should brace yourself for far steeper ticket and concession prices than in the rest of the country (with the possible exception of LA). Dinner and a movie turns out to be a rather exorbitant affair, but hey, we don't live in the Big Apple because it's cheap. And whether you're looking for the latest box office hit, or a classic from the French New Wave, there's a theater to meet your needs.

If you're after a first-run Hollywood blockbuster, we highly recommend the **AMC Loews Kips Bay (Map 10)** in Murray Hill. It has spacious theaters with large screens, big sound, comfortable seats, plenty of aisle room, and most importantly, fewer people! The **Regal Union Square 14 (Map 6)** is gargantuan, too, but movies there sit out hours or days in advance on the weekends. An IMAX theater and a cheery '30s movie palace decorating theme make **AMC Loews Lincoln Square (Map 14)** a great place to catch a huge film, and its ideal location offers loads of after-movie options. Another great choice is the **Regal Battery Park 16 (p 202)**, but it's starting to get just as crowded as the Union Square location.

For independent or foreign films, the **Landmark Sunshine (Map 6)** has surpassed the **Angelika (Map 6)** as the superior downtown movie house. Don't get us wrong—the Angelika still presents some great movies, but the tiny screens and constant subway rumble can sometimes make you wish you'd waited for the DVD. Any list of hip venues would be incomplete without the **Two Boots Pioneer (Map 7)**, which specializes in documentaries, short films, cool film series, and festivals. If you're looking

for revivals, check the listings at the **Film Forum (Map 5)**, **BAM Rose Cinemas (Map 31)**, and the **MoMa (Map 12)**. Regular attendees at those venues can provide an excellent education in cinema history. Finally, for the truly adventurous, there's **Anthology Film Archives (Map 6)**, which plays a repertoire of forgotten classics, obscure international hits, and experimental American shorts.

The most decadent and enjoyable movie experiences can be found at the theaters that feel the most "New York." Sadly, the Beekman Theatre immortalized in Woody Allen's *Annie Hall* was demolished in 2005 to make room for a new ward for Sloan-Kettering (it's hard to argue with a cancer hospital, but film buffs can't help but wish they'd found another space for their expansion). **Clearview's Ziegfeld (Map 12)** on 54th Street is a vestige from a time long past when movie theaters were real works of art. This space is so posh with its gilding and red velvet, you'll feel like you're crossing the Atlantic on an expensive ocean liner. The **Paris Theatre (Map 12)** on 58th Street is one of our favorites in the city—it has the best balcony, hands down! Finally, if you enjoy **Bollywood** musicals and other Asian imports, check out **The ImagineAsian (Map 13)**. Not only does it have the best name of any theater in the city, it has some of its best films.

Oh, and don't forget to use Moviefone (777-FILM; www.moviefone.com) or Fandango (www.fandango.com) to purchase tickets in advance for crowded showtimes (opening weekends, holidays, or pretty much any night when you're trying to see a popular film).

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Arts & Entertainment • Museums

Make a resolution: Go to at least one museum in New York City every month. There are over 100 museums in the five boroughs, from the **Metropolitan Museum of Art (Map 15)** to the **Dyckman Farmhouse Museum (Map 25)**, an 18th-century relic in children's Manhattan. Many of these museums have special programs and lectures that are open to the public, as well as upper's events and summer festivals. When you've found your favorite museums, look into membership. Benefits include free admission, guest passes, party invites, and a discount at the gift shop.

The famous Museum Mile comprises nine world-class museums along Fifth Avenue between 82nd Street and 105th Street, including the **Met (Map 15)**, and Frank Lloyd Wright's architectural masterpiece, the **Guggenheim (Map 17)**. **El Museo del Barrio (Map 17)**, devoted to early Latin American art. **The Museum of the City of New York (Map 17)**, the **Cooper-Hewitt National Design Museum (Map 17)** (housed in the Andrew Carnegie's Mansion), and the **Jewish Museum (Map 17)** are also along the mile. A few blocks off the stretch is **The Whitney Museum of American Art (Map 15)**, which showcases contemporary American art and features the celebrated Biennial in even-numbered years.

See medieval European art at the **Cloisters (Map 25)** (also a famous picnic spot), exhibitions of up and coming African-American artists at the **Studio Museum in Harlem (Map 19)**, and **PS1 (Map 27)** (MoMA's satellite) for contemporary art. Take the kids to the **Brooklyn Children's Museum** or the **Children's Museum of Manhattan (Map 14)**. The **Lower East Side Tenement Museum (Map 4)** and the **Ellis Island Immigration Museum (Map 1)** stand as reminders of the past, while the **Hayden Planetarium (Map 14)** offers visions of the future. The treasures of the Orient are on display at the **Asia Society (Map 15)**, and coach potatoes can watch the tube all day at the **Museum of Television and Radio (Map 12)**. The **Brooklyn Museum** supplements its wide-ranging permanent collection with edgy exhibitions, performances, and other special events

Just about every museum in the city is worth a visit. Other favorites include Other favorites include the **New Museum of Contemporary Art (Map 6)** (in its spiffy new building on The Bowery), the **New-York Historical Society (Map 14)** (which focuses its exhibits on the birth of the city), the **New York Transit Museum (Map 30)**, the **Morgan Library (Map 9)** (with copies of Gutenberg's Bible on display), the **Museum of the Moving Image (Map 26)**, the **Museum of Sex (Map 9)**, the **New Museum of Contemporary Art (Map 6)** and the **Queens Museum of Art** (check out the panorama of New York City).

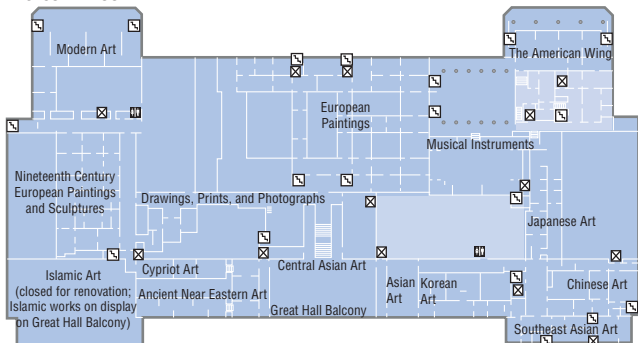

Overview

The Metropolitan Museum of Art is touted as the largest and most comprehensive museum in the Western hemisphere. Established by a group of American businessmen, artists, and thinkers back in 1870, the museum was created to preserve and stimulate appreciation for some of the greatest works of art in history.

In the first few years of its existence, the museum moved from its original location at 681 Fifth Avenue to the Douglas Mansion at 128 W 14th Street, and then finally to its current Central Park location in 1880.

Calvert Vaux and Jacob Wrey Mould designed the museum’s Gothic Revival red-brick facade, which was later remodeled in 1926 into the grand, white-columned front entrance that you see today. Part of the original facade was left intact and can still be seen from the Robert Lehman Wing looking toward the European Sculpture and Decorative Arts galleries.

The Met’s annual attendance reaches over 4 million visitors who flock to see the more than 2 million works of art housed in the museum’s permanent collection. You could visit the museum many times and not see more than a small portion of the permanent collection. The vast paintings anthology had a modest beginning in 1870 with a small donation of 174 European paintings and has now swelled to include works spanning 5,000 years of world culture, from the prehistoric to the present and from every corner of the globe.

The Met is broken down into a series of smaller museums within each building. For instance, the American Wing contains the most complete accumulation of American paintings, sculpture, and decorative arts, including period rooms offering a look at domestic life throughout the nation’s history. The Egyptian collection is the finest in the world outside of Cairo, and the Islamic art exhibition remains unparalleled, as does the mass of 2,500 European paintings and Impressionist and Post-Impressionist works. The permanent gallery

of Islamic art underwent renovations in 2008, following the 10-15 year renovation of the Greek & Roman collection. The redesigned galleries display works that have been in storage for decades, assuring even the most frequent visitor something fresh to check out including the museum’s newly restored, world-famous, non-gazuzzing **Etruscan chariot**.

Other major collections include the arms and armor, Asian art, costumes, European sculpture and decorative arts, medieval and Renaissance art, musical instruments, drawings, prints, ancient antiquities from around the world, photography, and modern art. Add to this the many special exhibits and performances the Met offers throughout the year, and you have a world-class museum with Central Park as its backyard.

This is a massive museum and seating can be difficult to find during busy weekends. When you need a break from all of the culture, sit down for a snack in the American Wing Café or lunch in the cafeteria. If you pal around with a member (or become one yourself), it is a treat to eat in the Trustees Dining Room overlooking the park.

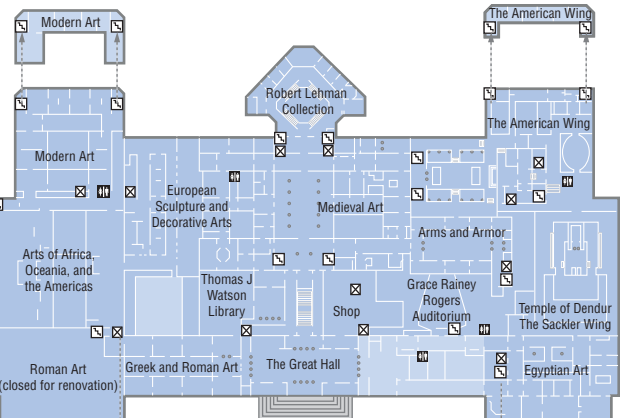
The Greatest Hits

You can, of course, spend countless hours at the Met. Pick any style of art and chances are you will find a piece here. But if you’re rushed for time, check out the sublime space that houses the **Temple of Dendur** in the Sackler Wing, the elegant **Frank Lloyd Wright Room** in the American Wing, the fabulous **Tiffany Glass** and **Tiffany Mosaics**, also in the American Wing, the **choir screen** in the Medieval Sculpture Hall, the **Caravaggios** and **Goyas** in the Renaissance Rooms, the **Picassos** and **Pollocks** in Modern Art, and that huge **canoe** in Arts of Africa and Oceania. For a moment of tranquility, visit the beautiful Chinese Garden Court in the Asian galleries. When it’s open, we highly recommend the **Roof Garden**, which has killer views of Central Park as a side dish to cocktails and conversation. When it’s not, check out seasonal specials like the **Christmas “Angel” Tree** and **Neopolitan Baroque Crêche**, an annual favorite set up in front of the medieval choir screen.

Overview

Admit it. You secretly TiVo the Discovery Channel and the History Channel. You've even watched one—if not several—episodes of *Star Trek*. Something about African beetles, famous dead guys, and the unknown universe strokes your inner Einstein. Focus your microscope on this one, smarty-pants: the American Museum of Natural History, a paradise for geeks and aspiring geeks alike, not to mention good old nature lovers. And don't worry, your TV-watching secrets are safe with us.

Decades before anyone knew what an atom was, and when relativity was just a twinkle in Einstein's eye, Albert Smith Bickmore established the AMNH. Completed in 1869, the museum held its first exhibition in the Central Park Arsenal a few years later, garnering enough respect to acquire space along class Central Park West. Architects Calvert Vaux and J. Wrey Mould designed the new, posh building on limited Benjamins and opened it to the public in 1877. Key additions followed: The Hayden Planetarium in 1935, the Theodore Roosevelt Memorial Hall and Rotunda in 1936, and the Rose Center for Earth and Space in 2000.

As Saturday morning museum-going ritual dictates, it's going to be painfully crowded. On those days, you dodge out-of-towners, eyes wide, mouths gaping. It's much the same on weekdays with rowdy school kids on field trips. How to avoid the Excedrin-inducing atmosphere? Two words: permanent collection. The amazing series of wildlife dioramas even inspired an entire Hollywood movie (albeit not a great one, by adult standards). Don't expect to see any PETA supporters in these halls though.

When you can go at off hours, or if you feel you can brave the crowds, make a point of checking out the fascinating and often provocative special exhibits. Recent highlights have included Darwin and Water: H2O=Life.

The Greatest Hits

Five floors of star-lovin', mammal-gazin', bird-watchin', fossil-fuelin' science await. Rain forest fever? Check out the Hall of Biodiversity. Didn't understand why that movie was called *The Squid and The Whale*? Meet the 94-foot long great blue whale and his giant squid companion at the Milstein Hall of Ocean Life. Moby teamed up with MTV2 and the Hayden Planetarium in the Rose Center for Earth and Space to produce SonicVision, an animated alternative music show that poses the question: How do you see your music? Another thought-provoking show with a celebrity element (narration by Harrison Ford) is *The Search for Life: Are We Alone?* For more instant thrills, check out the gigantic meteorites at the Arthur Ross Hall of Meteorites, or the five-story-tall dinosaur display in the Theodore Roosevelt Rotunda. It's the largest freestanding beast in the world. The AMNH also produces spectacular IMAX features, a great alternative to the museum's amazing but creepy taxidermy. The Hall of Gems houses the Star of India, the largest star sapphire in the world. Finally, for recreation of *The Birds* variety with less evil, visit The Butterfly Conservatory. Tropical butterflies fit all around you from, you guessed it, all over the world. It's enough to put TiVo on pause.

Overview

The Museum of Modern Art opened in 1929, back when Impressionism and surrealism were truly modern art. SOriously in the Heckscher Building at 730 Fifth Avenue, MoMA moved to its current address on West 53rd Street in 1932. What started out as a townhouse eventually expanded into an enormous space, with new buildings and additions in 1939 (by Phillip L. Goodwin and Edward Durell Stone), 1953 (including a sculpture garden by Phillip Johnson), 1964 (another Johnson garden), and 1984 (by Cesar Pelli). During the summer of 2002, the museum closed its Manhattan location and moved temporarily to Long Island City (MoMA's affiliate, PS1 Contemporary Art Center, is still there). After a major expansion and renovation by Yoshio Taniguchi, MoMA reopened in September 2004. Opinions vary as to the success of Taniguchi's new design, but the art is the point, right?

Wrong. Museums are one of the last great bastions of inventive, exciting, fun, not-necessarily-practical architecture. Taniguchi's design uses all available space, which, considering the price of midtown real estate, must have been a selling point for his design. Other than that, you'll have to trek up to the Guggenheim, fly off to Bilbao, or head downtown to the New Museum of Contemporary Art's new Bowery digs to see better marriages of art and design.

The re-Manhattanized museum charges \$20. If crowds on a typical Saturday afternoon are any indication, the hefty entry fee is not keeping patrons away. Art lovers take note: The yearly \$75 membership (\$120 for a dual and \$150 for a family) is the way to go. Members get a 10% discount at MoMA stores, free tickets to all film screenings, and you're free to pop in whenever you want to see your favorite Picasso (or use the restroom). For the best deal, visit the museum from 4–8 pm on Fridays, when Target sponsors free admission. The crowds aren't as bad as you might think, and you can usually slide right past the main desk and grab one of the free tickets that they scatter there.

What to See

The fourth and fifth floors are where the big names reside—Johns, Pollack, Warhol (fourth floor), Braque, Cezanne, Dalí, Duchamp, Ernst, Hopper, Kandinsky, Klee, Matise, Miro, Monet, Picasso, Rousseau, Seurat, Van Gogh, and Wyeth (fifth floor). More recent works can be found in the contemporary gallery on the second floor. Special exhibitions are featured on the third and sixth floors. The surrealist collection is outstanding, but we suspect that MoMA has only a tiny fraction of its pop art on display. Well, you can't have everything...

Moving downstairs to the third floor, it's clear that the photography collection is, as always, one of the centerpieces of the museum and is highly recommended (although the Gursky pieces are actually dotted throughout the building). The architecture and design gallery showcases a range of cool consumer items, from chairs to cars to the first Mac computers, and is one of the most popular destinations in the museum.

Recent exhibits, such as Doug Aitken's *Sleepwalkers*—which was the first to project film scenes onto MoMA's exterior walls—provide hope that the museum will only continue to be more innovative in the future.

Amenities

Backpacks and large purses are not allowed in gallery spaces, and the free coat check can become messy when the check-in and check-out lines become intertwined. Leave large items (including laptops) at home.

Bathrooms and water fountains are on all floors. We don't think that there are enough of them, and the bathrooms themselves are way too small to handle the crowds.

There are three places to get food in the museum—you'll pay heavily for the convenience and Danny Meyer experience. Café 2, located on the second floor, offers "seasonal Roman fare," also known as "snooty Italian." They also have an espresso bar. Terrace 5, which overlooks the beautiful sculpture garden, has desserts, chocolates, and sandwiches, along with wine, cocktails, coffee, and tea. Both cafes open half an hour after the museum opens its doors and close half an hour before the museum closes.

For the ultimate museum dining experience, The Modern features the cuisine of Gabriel Kreuther. It has two main rooms—the Dining Room overlooks the sculpture garden, and the Bar Room is more casual and overlooks the bar. An outdoor terrace is also made available when the weather permits. The Modern serves French and New American food and features wild game menu items—sounds great if you've got a platinum card.

The Modern is open beyond museum hours, with the Dining Room closing at 10:30 pm Monday–Thursday, and 11:30 pm on Friday and Saturday. The Bar Room closes at 10:30 pm Monday–Thursday, at 11 pm on Friday and Saturday, and 9:30 pm on Sunday. There's a separate street entrance to allow diners access to The Modern after the museum closes.

On warm summer days, a gelato bar in the sculpture garden offers yummy sorbets.

So long as there are adventurous artists putting on plays in abandoned storefronts and opportunistic real estate developers knocking down beautiful old theaters to put up hotels, the New York theater scene will always be adding a few venues here and deleting a few venues there. What remains constant is that on any given night there are at least dozens, and more often hundreds, of live theater performances to be seen. And the best ones are not always the most expensive.

Broadway (theaters in the Times Square vicinity that hold at least 500 people) still has the reputation of being the place to see American theater at its finest, but the peculiar fact of the matter is that there is more much money to be gained by appealing to the infrequent theater goer than there is by trying to please the connoisseur. As a result, shows that are looked down on, if not despised, by many lovers of the theater wind up selling out for years (*Mamma Mia!*, anyone?), while more ambitious, artistically admired plays and musicals struggle to find an audience. Check out theater chat boards like BroadwayWorld.com and TalkinBroadway.com to see what the people who see everything have to say.

Nobody gets famous doing live theater anymore, so if you've never heard of the actor whose name is twinkling in lights (Cherry Jones, Brian Stokes Mitchell, Raul Esparza, Christine Ebersole...) chances are that person has the stage experience and acting chops to keep you enthralled for two and a half hours, unlike the big name celebrities (P. Diddy, Melanie Griffith) who make their stage acting debuts in starring roles they're not prepared for. Of course, there are also actors with extensive stage credits who come back to Broadway regularly after becoming famous. That's why we love John Lithgow, Cynthia Nixon, and Phylcia Rashad.

Many great performers work Off-Broadway (Manhattan theaters seating 100–499 people) where the writing and directing are actually more important than spectacle and scores made up of classic pop songs. Off-Broadway (fewer than 100 seats) is a terrific grab bag of both beginners and seasoned pros doing material that is often unlikely to draw in masses. And tickets are pretty cheap, too.

TheaterMania.com keeps an extensive list of just about every show in New York, with direct links to the websites that sell tickets. Many shows offer a limited number of inexpensive standing room and/or same-day rush tickets. A detailed directory of such offers can be found at TalkinBroadway.com.

Thousands of same-day tickets for Broadway and Off-Broadway shows are sold for 25%–50% off at the TKTS booths in Times Square (long lines) and at the South Street Seaport (short lines). They take cash and traveler's checks only. Check for hours and to see what's been recently available at www.tdf.org. Don't expect to get a bargain for the top-selling hits, but most shows use this booth at some time or another. You can also download discount coupons at Playbill.com that you can use to get seats in advance.

The dirty little secret of New York theatre is that free tickets for high-quality shows (aka not Grease, Wicked, or The Lion King etc) are abundantly available though organizations that specialize in "dressing the house" for productions that depend more on word of mouth than expensive advertising costs. By giving a yearly membership fee of around \$100 to AudienceExtras.com or Play-By-Play.com, you can check your computer 24-hours a day to find free tickets (there's a per-ticket service charge of \$3) for a dozen or so Off-, Off-Off-, and sometimes Broadway shows available at the last minute. That dinky little play in some church basement that you went to on a whim might wind up being the next great American classic. And if it isn't, you only spent 3 bucks.

Keep an eye out for shows by these lesser-known companies:

The young Classical theater of Harlem (www.classicaltheaterofharlem.org) has quickly earned a reputation for mounting exciting, edgy revivals of classics from Shakespeare and Brecht, as well as solid productions from more recent greats such as August Wilson and Melvin Van Peebles. A multicultural company that frequently casts against racial type, they draw a youthful audience with imaginative interpretations.

The Mint Theater Company (www.minttheater.org) specializes in reviving Broadway plays from the past they call "worthy, but neglected." In their tiny space you'll see interesting comedies and dramas from the likes of A. A. Milne, Edith Wharton, and Thomas Wolfe played traditionally with sets and costumes that really make you feel like you're watching a production from over 50 years ago.

Musicals Tonight! does the same kind of thing with forgotten musicals, only presenting them in low budgetted, but highly energized, staged readings. Nowadays most musicals revived on Broadway are revised and updated to the point where they're not authentic. But if you're in the mood to see what an living Berlin ragtime show from 1915 was really like, or if you want to see a Cole Porter tuner from the '30s with all of the dated topical references that confused audiences even back then, Musicals Tonight! serves up the past as it really was written. And check for their special concerts where Broadway understudies sing songs from the roles they are currently covering.

Broadway insiders know that Monday nights, when most shows are dark, is often the hottest night of the week for entertainment. That's when performers use their night off to partake in benefits and special events. Consistently among the best are shows from Scott Siegel's Broadway By The Year series at Town Hall (www.townhall-nyc.org). Each one-night concert is packed with theater and cabaret stars singing hits and obscurities introduced on Broadway in one selected year. Siegel also produces Broadway Unplugged at Town Hall, a concert of theater performers singing showtunes without amplification. The atmosphere is like a sports event, with the audience wildly cheering each naturally voiced solo.

Theaters / Performing Arts

Pearl Theatre Company (Map 6) (www.pearltheatre.org), presently located at 80 St. Mark's Place, is one of the 15 or so largest institutional theaters in New York City. Now in their 23rd year, they continue to grow as a resident company and a classical repertory, offering delights from Sheridan, Shakespeare, Aeschylus, Marivaux, and Ibsen.

Now in its eighth season, Horse Trade (www.htheatre.org) continues its commitment to producing a varied program of performance series, readings, workshops, and fully realized productions. Most events are performed at **The Kraine Theater (Map 6)**, which also houses the **Red Room (Map 6)** on its third floor. The theaters are also available to rent for rehearsals and performances.

HERE (Map 5) (www.here.org) not only houses two small theaters, but it also has an amazing gallery space and a cozy café/bar—perfect for pre- or post-show drinks.

In Chelsea, **The Kitchen (Map 8)** (www.thekitchen.org) literally began in the unused kitchen of the Mercer Arts Center, housed in the Broadway Central Hotel in Greenwich Village. In 1985, The Kitchen moved into its permanent home at 512 West 19th Street. The venue plays host to new performance artists blending music, dance, video, art, and spoken word.

Located in a former public school on First Avenue and 9th Street in the East Village, **P.S. 122 (Map 7)** (www.ps122.org) is a not-for-profit arts center serving New York City's dance and performance community. Shows rotate through on a regular basis, so check the website for the latest schedule. The outdoor **Delacorte Theater (Map 15)** in Central Park hosts performances only during the summer months. Tickets to the ridiculously popular and free Shakespeare in the Park performances are given away at 1 pm at the Delacorte and also at the **Public Theater (Map 6)** on the day of each performance. Hopefully, you enjoy camping because people line up for days in their tents and sleeping bags just to secure a ticket!

Just on the other side of the Manhattan Bridge in Brooklyn is the world famous Brooklyn Academy of Music. A thriving urban arts center, BAM brings domestic and international performing arts and film to Brooklyn. The center includes two theaters (**Harvey Lichtenstein Theater** and **Howard Gilman Opera House (Map 31)**), the Bam Rose Cinemas, and the BAMcafé, a restaurant and live music venue. Our favorite season is the Next Wave, an annual three-month celebration of cutting-edge dance, theater, music, and opera.
